GREETINGS CROYDONITES!

We are very proud to bring you the 7th edition of the Croydonites Festival. Over the years we've grown from presenting just a few companies to over twenty in 2024. This year we have a delightful mix of performance, dance, comedy and storytelling as well as the hottest thing in immersive theatre right now.

We are producing two participatory events with local casts including We Can Be Heroes. the brainchild of French choreographer **Arnaud Pirault**. This lip-syncing rollercoaster ride transports you from Shirley Bassey to Eninem, a joyful and ironic takeover of public space. In his second visit Richard **DeDomenici** will create a low-budget remake from the award-winning romantic fantasy All Of Us Strangers, with all the roles played

by a local cast.

Other highlights include Sarah Baltzinger and Isaiah Wilson from Luxembourg with their performative dance duet MEGASTRUCTURE, a work whose pieces are constantly being dismantled, tested and reinvented; and HurlyBurly Theatre make their first visit to Croydonites with You Are the Sun, a folk inspired opera for babies and grown-ups that explores the magic of nature.

James Rowland dies at the end of the show is a masterclass in storytelling which asks 'What would you do with an hour? What if it was your last hour ever?' Wendy Houstoun also asks questions, this time about identity, personal truth and political ideology in a ridiculous Game Show for One, WATCH IT!

We round off the festival with *The Manikins*: a work in progress by **Deadweight Theatre**. a ninety-minute performance by two actors for a single audience member. A labyrinthine conspiracy, a cold war between dream and reality, a constantly transforming psychedelic world that slips like sand between your fingers. It's an experience like no other.

We are still committed to nurturing local artists through commissioning and showcasing their work. In 2024 eight local artists are taking part in CroydonBites;

Chardine Makaveli-Singh and Nathan **Brown-Bennett** from the 2023 cohort have been supported to develop their earlier works; and the first round of this three year cycle comes to fruition with a work in progress by Simon Manyonda (Rye Lane, The Bay, His Dark Materials). Blessed, Tryna Break This Curse is a Theatrical Mixtape of late 90s early 00's nostalgia where Garage Music, Dawson's Creek and Croydon Night Life soundtrack a coming of age tale, following a young man's yearning to transcend his life and become an Actor. We are delighted to partner with **Talawa Theatre Company** to realise this work which will be presented in their studios.

Plus...we've added a fringe. 20 artists in 4 venues over 4 days from 31 Oct - 3 Nov. It's a monster! We can't wait to share it with you.

From 31 Oct - 3 November there are 20 shows on offer in 4 venues across Croydon Town Centre. We have performance, new writing, comedy, film, music and site-specific. I hope you're ready!

We also have a series of free events on Saturday 2 November in the town centre. We Can Be Heroes by French choreographer Arnaud Pirault, performed by a local community cast in Whitgift Square; and The Working Boys Club and Bedlam Oz in North End.



CHARDINE MAKAVELI-SINGH A CRONX TALE STEFANS STORY (FILM)

A Cronx Tale is a short, animated film about the dangers of getting involved in gangs, street crime and county lines. Through animation it looks at how actions have consequences, and using a mixture of reality and fiction, its aim is to leave an impact and create positive change. This film is the first in a trilogy, telling a story from different viewpoints and using different mediums. Followed by a Q&A.

Stefans Story is the first part of a trilogy, the second film is centred around the theme of robbery; the consequences for the perpetrator and the impact on the victim. The film aims to educate young people, steering them away from street crime and offering guidance to potential victims on how to stay safe. The third film will focus on the issue of violence against women and girls, and how they can spot the signs of grooming and exploitation. All three films will be touring in schools.

NATHAN BROWN-BENNETT & MARISA OLUSEMO AGAIN, AGAIN AND AGAIN (AKA. CANCELLED X2)

A deep dive into the human psyche through spoken word, music, and theatre. How do our emotions have an impact on our relationships and mental health? Embark on a journey of dark and light moments that are sure to have an impact. Covering topics of sexual assault, bereavement, and anxiety.

Again, Again & Again is a collaborative project featuring spoken word, rap and singing; written and produced by Nathan Brown-Bennett & Marisa Olusemo.

Croydonites Commissioning Pathways

Croydonites is committed to nurturing local artists through its commissioning pathway from initial idea, to a work in progress performance, to a finished work.

Both Chardine and Nathan presented work in CroydonBites (for short works) in 2023 and have been supported in 2024 with a commissioning fee, rehearsal space and a mentor. They are also the recipients of additional funding from Stanley Arts to develop these works.
